

Notice of City Council Vacancy

The City of Lowell is seeking a civic-minded and engaged citizen to fill a vacancy on the City Council. The new City Councilor's term will last until December 2022. You will have the opportunity to run for election during the November 2022 elections, if you so choose.

As a City Councilor, you will set the vision and direction for the city. You will vote on the budget and city policies. You will work with the Mayor, other City Councilors, and city staff and volunteers to achieve the city's goals.

This is a volunteer position. City Council meets the first and third Tuesdays of the month at 7:00 pm, and attendance is required. If you are interested in giving back to the community, consider applying.

Applications are due Monday, March 28 by 4:00 pm. City Council will review the applications and may interview City Councilor candidates prior to appointing someone to fill the vacancy.

<u>Qualifications</u>: Must be at least 18 years of age and a resident of the City of Lowell for at least 12 months prior to appointment.

<u>To apply:</u> Send a completed and signed "Volunteer Boards & Commission Application" to City Administrator Jeremy Caudle in person, by email, or by mail. Library and City Hall Construction Project Update

Thank you to all the residents and businesses who contributed to our end of year fundraiser for the library. We set a goal of raising \$3,000. We exceeded that goal and have raised \$11,570 from over 70 individual donors. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to demonstrate continued support from the community in our application for grant funding. We were informed earlier this month that we will be receiving a gift of \$191,466 from The Ford Family Foundation for the library renovation. All our financing sources are now secured, and we are set to bid out the construction for this project during the week of February 28. If everything goes according to plan, we will be moving into the new City Hall and library by the end of the year.

Help Update Our Development Code

The City is restarting a code update project which includes incorporating the 2019 Downtown Master Plan into the Lowell Development Code as well as making other broader adjustments to the Code. This includes access standards, lot standards, street standards and longstanding housekeeping items.

The City is looking for committee members who will represent the following groups or interests:

- Lowell School District
- Lowell Rural Fire Protection District
- ♦ Youth
- Non-motorized transportation advocate (such as walking and bicycling)
- Downtown small business owners or other person familiar with downtown

The Code Committee will serve as the stakeholder group for the Project and provide feedback to a Project Management Team on Project deliverables. The Committees will serve in advisory role, providing important perspectives on draft code concepts.

The Committee will meet 1-2 times and will be expected to carefully review draft materials and respectfully provide representative and productive critiques and insights to the materials. The first meeting is expected to be held in the Spring of 2022.

Classes are conducted by a certified pilates instructor. Mats will be provided but feel free to bring your own if you prefer. For more information,


Yoga at the Grange
