#### Lowell Music Continues Its Dominance, Heading to State and Traveling Abroad

On April 5th, the Lowell High School Choir traveled all the way to Marshfield High School for the OMEA District 7 Choir Festival, hoping to qualify for this year's OSAA State Finals. Not only did they meet the qualifying standard, they also managed to take high score for the entire festival, even besting last year's 5A State Runner-Up! The District Champions will be heading to State Finals, scheduled for May 4th at LaSells Stewart Center on the campus of Oregon State University. The LHS Band also followed-up their dominant March with their highest scores of the season at the OMEA District 10 Festival on April 12th.

OSAA State Band Finals will be held at the same location on May 12th. Neither schedule was available at the time of this writing, but should be posted on OSAA.org by press time. Spectators are encouraged; tickets (\$12 adults, \$6 students) must be purchased in advance via the OSAA website or app.

Our 50 high school musicians will also be stepping out at the end of May, as they head to a competition and tour of Seattle and Victoria, British Columbia. This 5-day trip, long delayed by COVID, has been highly anticipated for over three years! Along with competing in the Music in the Parks competition, the kids will enjoy sightseeing, museums, the Wild Waves Theme & Water Park, a Seattle Mariners baseball game and more! #### ALL-AMERICAN WRESTLERS





# City Beat by City Administrator Jeremy Caudle

#### Accessory dwelling units are now allowed in the city. The city's new development code allows up to two accessory dwelling units (ADU) per single-family dwelling. An ADU is a smaller, independent dwelling on the same lot as a single-family home. ADUs create a range of housing options.

You can build an ADU on your property to generate rental income, provide a residence for an aging relative to stay near family, and so on. ADUs can be an addition to your home, a converted portion of your home, or a standalone structure. ADUs qualify for expedited approval through the city's planning process. If you're interested in building an ADU, contact City Hall for more details. **The City of Lowell is hiring a part-time seasonal worker.** The pay is \$16.00 per hour. Responsibilities include general landscaping, operating power equipment, and maintaining city properties. For more detail, and instructions on how to apply, visit:

#### Notice of public hearing on proposed updates to water and parks system development charg-

**es.** The City Council will hold a public hearing on July 18, 2023 at 7:00 pm on proposed increases to the water and parks system development charges (SDC). The water SDC is proposed to increase from \$4,575 per equivalent dwelling unit (EDU) to \$7,068 per EDU. The parks SDC is proposed to increase from \$985 per EDU to \$1,004 per EDU. This information is also available in person at City Hall during normal business hours. The city maintains a list of persons who have made a written request for notification prior to adoption or amendment of a methodology for any system development charge. As of the date of this notice, no person has signed up for the notification list. To be notified of any future changes to SDC methodologies, please contact Lowell City Hall.

**Notice of Budget Committee vacancies.** The City is still looking for volunteers to serve on the Budget Committee. The time commitment is 1 to 2 hours per meeting. The Budget Committee usually meets only once per year to review and approve the recommended budget. We need 3 new members to participate in May's upcoming budget meetings. 


