Over the last two years, the City of Lowell, along with the Department of Land Conservation and Development's TGM Assistance Grant, has been working on implementing the recommended code changes as was found in the Lowell Downtown Master Plan. The project also addresses several "housekeeping" updates to various portions of the Development Code and addresses minimum lot standards for residential zoning districts.

A vital portion of the project is public outreach and engagement. The City of Lowell, DCLD and the consultant have prepared a draft version of the updated Development Code. We are ready to share that draft with the community at-large to garner feedback from the community of Lowell. The City of Lowell will hold an open-house community meeting where the public can engage with City staff and review the proposed code updates. Light refreshments will be provided.

A Reminder that Fire Season Is Not Over Yet

Fire Season is still with us and it is important to keep fire safety in mind at all times. Outdoor burning is prohibited and may open in October depending on weather and environmental conditions. Campfires and/or warming fires in most locations are prohibited and will remain prohibited until vegetation fire levels are greatly reduced by significant moisture. Contact the district office for more information on current fire safety considerations in the area.

Please also make sure that we leave the roadways open for fire personnel to respond when they are needed. It is very important to us to keep our community safe. While we appreciate the offer of assistance, we have the proper protection and training to get the job done safely.

Ever Think About Becoming A Firefighter?

Ever want to do something new and exciting? Want to learn new and valuable life skills? Think about joining the Fire Service and help your community.

Volunteers are critical to our nation's fire and emergency services. 69% (or 786,150) of firefighters in the U.S. are volunteers. These volunteers save communities \$140 billion annually. However, the number of volunteers has declined by about 12% since 1984. During the same timeframe, call volume has nearly tripled, largely due to the increase in EMS calls. In 2013, there were over 31 million calls to local fire departments.

The volunteer fire service is an aging population. Since 2000, there has been a 14.9 percent drop in the number of firefighters under the age of 40 in communities like ours. Communities our size rely almost entirely on volunteers.

There are many reasons for these trends, including:

- ♦ Increased time demands placed on firefighters and EMTs or more rigorous training requirements
- ♦ Proliferation of two-income families whose members have less available time
- ♦ Younger people moving out of smaller communities for better job opportunities

The Lowell Rural Fire Protection District is almost all Volunteer. We have a full-time (40+ hour per week) paid Fire Chief and 3 full-time (48/96) paid Shift Officers.

The District currently has 18 shift Volunteer Firefighter/EMTs and one Volunteer cadet Firefighter/EMT. The District needs more volunteer members to help protect the communities of Lowell, Fall Creek and Unity. You will receive all the training you want locally; all you need to do is apply.
