

ROWAN FILES BREAKS RECORDS

On Thursday, April 11 in Pleasant Hill, Rowan left spectators in awe as he not only raced past competitors but also left a trail of shattered school records in his wake. With an astonishing time of 11.2 seconds in the 100m sprint, Rowan took the gold and earned a spot on Lowell High School's record board. But Rowan didn't stop there. In the 200m event, he blazed across the finish line in an astounding 22.9 seconds, surpassing even his own state championship-winning time from 2022.

What makes Rowan's achievement even more remarkable is that this isn't his first time rewriting the record books. Last year, he made history by breaking the school javelin record, showcasing his versatility and dominance across multiple disciplines. With each stride Rowan takes and each record he shatters, he continues to leave an indelible mark on Lowell, inspiring generations of track and field athletes to come.

As we celebrate Rowan's incredible accomplishments, we eagerly anticipate what the future holds for this extraordinary athlete and his teammates in the postseason. The District Championships will be held at Bandon High School on May 11, and the State Championships will be at Hayward Field on May 16-17.

Notice of City of Lowell Budget Committee Meeting and Public Hearing on the Use of State Revenue Sharing Funds. A public meeting of the Budget Committee of the City of Lowell, located in Lane County, Oregon, to discuss the budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025 will be held at the Lowell Rural Fire Protection District Fire Station 1, 389 N. Pioneer Street, Lowell, OR 97452. The meeting will take place on May 9, 2024 at 6:00 pm.

The purpose of this meeting is to receive the budget message and to receive comment from the public on the budget. This is a public meeting where deliberation of the Budget Committee will take place. Any person may appear at the meeting and discuss the proposed programs with the Budget Committee. Additionally, a public hearing concerning the allocation of "State Revenue Sharing Funds" will be conducted during this meeting in accordance with ORS 221.770. Citizens are invited to propose uses for these funds, distributed by the State of Oregon to the City of Lowell for the fiscal year in question.

Subsequent Budget Committee meetings are planned for May 15, 2024, and May 22, 2024, both commencing at 6:00 pm. However, these meetings will only be held if necessary.

All meetings will be accessible for viewing and participation via video conference through the City's designated Zoom meeting. Instructions for joining the Zoom sessions can be found on the respective meeting page of the city's website: www.ci.lowell.or.us. Recordings of the meetings will also be made available on the City website no later than 5 business days after each meeting.

Public comments can be submitted in written format, via participation in the Zoom meeting, or in-person at the meeting location. Written comments received by 4:00 pm on May 9, 2024, will be read during the public comment section of the meeting held on the same day. Comments through Zoom or in-person participation will also be taken during the public comment section of the May 9, 2024, meeting.

Additionally, physical copies of the budget document are available during regular business hours (Monday through Thursday, 8:00 am to 5:30 pm) at Lowell City Hall, located at 70 N. Pioneer St., Lowell, OR 97452. The recommended budget document for the 2024-2025 fiscal year will be available for inspection no later than May 1, 2024.

Update on e-permitting program. In May, the city will start working with the Oregon Building Codes Division on joining their e-permitting program. The purpose of this program is to shift the city's building permit process from a paper to electronic system. We also intend to include our land use application processes in the e-permitting program. This program will make the permitting process user friendly and efficient for the city, property owners, and builders. Best of all, the program is at no cost to the city, except our staff time to work with state officials to build the system. We will have the e-permitting system online before January 1, 2025.
